LAMB WANTS STATE LAND AUDIT

Lamb Says Sell Surplus Land

Hopkinton, MA ...Today Marty Lamb, candidate for State Representative in the Eighth Middlesex District and small business owner, announced that he will push for an audit of the state land so the state can sell or lease the surplus.

"While my opponent believes that there is only one way to increase state revenue which is to reach into our wallets for more money, I believe that there are other possibilities such as selling or leasing surplus land," said Lamb. "We have many parcels of land that could generate income."

Lamb points to the fact there are no rest stops or restaurant stops on the way to the Cape. If the land was leased or sold that could generate substantially income for the state. Lamb believes the first step in the process is to have an independent audit of state land. There are too many fiefdoms within state government where bureaucrats don't like to give up control or suggest a new solution. An outside audit will give the public a true accounting of land assets.

"Raising taxes is the wrong action to take during a recession. I am worried about the Speaker's statement two weeks ago when he refused to rule out raising taxes next year and the fact that Rep. Dykema votes with him almost all of the time. Hence, taxpayers are on a collision course with the legislature once again if we don't elect a new Representative committed to holding the line on taxes," said Lamb. "There are other ways to protect vital services such as real reforms and selling surplus land."

Last week Lamb announced that he wants to study making the leadership of the authorities to be co-terminus with the Governor so there is more accountability.

"If we continue to do the same thing over and over again, we will get the same results. Unlike my opponent, I have been putting forth new ideas. She has put forth no new ideas this election season," said Lamb.

"I will be a proactive leader for the district," added Lamb.

Mr. Lamb, a Massachusetts native, graduated from the Benjamin N. Cardozo School of Law at Yeshiva University in 1985 and received his Bachelor of Arts from Hampshire College in 1982. He has an extensive background in real estate law, formerly with Adelson, Golden & Loria, P.C., Edward A. Sokoloff & Associates and Lamb and Browne, P.C., is currently with Lamb and Associates, P.C. He is a member of the Real Estate Bar Association of Massachusetts. An active participant in community affairs, Mr. Lamb sits on the Board of Directors of New England Region of United Synagogue and is a past president of Temple Beth Torah in Holliston. He has also served on the Holliston Elementary School Council and the Campaign for Holliston Schools. He resides in Holliston with Peri, his wife of 22 years and his two daughters Elissa and Simma.
