
Welcome to Trottier Middle School!

Summer Reading -

School Supplies -

Many of you ordered school supplies last spring, they will be available for pick up at Trottier the week of August 21st. If you didn't pre-order school supplies, the lists can be found on the right side of the Trottier homepage.

Student Schedules -

Each student will receive their schedule during the first homeroom session on Wednesday, August 30th. You will notice a change. We have changed the name of our "Focus Study" to "Academic Preparation." This change is in name only and doesn't change the expectations. Students will have a scheduled period to manage their academics. Students have the opportunity to complete assignments, study for tests/quizzes, organize their materials, and access school resources. These tasks are expected to be prioritized by the student. Students are required to come prepared with school work. We have other graduated levels of support that are administered by our guidance department and student support services, which are based on student need. More information about these tiers can be explained by our guidance department.

Buses -

Lockers -

Each student will receive their locker assignment during the first homeroom session on August 30th.

Assignment Notebooks -

We are anticipated the Assignment Notebooks to be delivered the week of August 21st. Once they arrive, they will be available for purchase in the Trottier Office. They will also be available for purchase on the First Day of School.

What to bring on the First Day? -

- You can bring your supplies to school on the 1st day. You will have access to your locker during one of the homeroom sessions.
- If you don't have the complete set of supplies --- No worries! You can bring pens/pencils and backpack.
- Money for lunch (\$2.75) You can also bring your own lunch if you choose.
- Money for assignment notebook (\$5.00)
- Money for lock for locker (\$5.00) **6th grade ONLY**.
- Because we have field activities, please don't wear dressy clothes to school for 1st 2 days -- appropriate, comfortable summer clothes will work. (We do have a dress code at Trottier; you can find it on our website under "Our School" <u>Student Handbook</u>)

First Day of School Forms -

We will provide a checklist for parents and will post the documents on the Trottier website. All forms need to returned in hard copy to your son/daughter's homeroom teacher as soon as possible. A set of these documents will go home in backpacks on the first day of school.

Trottier Traffic Pattern -

Last June, we changed the traffic pattern for drop-off and pick-up. Collectively, the change was a success and we appreciate everyone's cooperation. Open House for New Students - Wednesday, August 23rd from 2-6pm

• This is a time to step into the building and take a "self-guided" tour. It breaks the ice and reminds students of the surroundings. It is geared towards new students or incoming 6th graders, however, it is always good for some 7th graders to pop by.

First Day of School - Wednesday, August 30th

If you are taking the bus, you will be dropped off at school sometime between 7:35 and 7:55 a.m. If you are getting a ride to school or riding your bike, you should plan to arrive between those times. When you arrive at school, 6th graders will be gathering in the cafeteria. The teachers, Mr. Hreschuk, and I will be meeting the buses and helping you figure out where to go. Also, if the buses are late, don't worry -- we will wait for all of the buses to arrive before we begin.

At Trottier, we do not have regular classes on the first two days of school. Instead, we celebrate the beginning of the year with assemblies and field activities, as well as having study skills sessions and community building activities to help you learn about

the school and get ready for a great year. We will also review school procedures and other logistical details.

Second Day of School - Thursday, August 31st

We will have another homeroom session followed by our Summer Reading Discussion groups and then we will follow a mini-schedule with shortened periods so that students may meet most of their teachers.

Third Day of School - We will run a normal Friday schedule on Friday, September 1st.

Labor Day - Monday, September 4th - School is not in session to observe Labor Day
