

As of September 1, 2022, a new bivalent COVID-19 booster vaccine is recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) for individuals ages 12 and up. These new COVID-19 booster vaccines from Moderna and Pfizer are updated versions of the original vaccines that target two Omicron subvariants. Anyone age 12 or older who completed a primary COVID-19 vaccination series or received a booster dose at least two months ago should get the updated booster as soon as possible.

Vaccine Frequently Asked Questions:

Who is eligible for a booster?

CDC recommends everyone ages 5 years and older receive a COVID-19 vaccine booster after completing their primary COVID-19 vaccination series. As of September 1, 2022, anyone age 12 or older who completed a primary COVID-19 vaccination series or received a booster dose at least two months ago should get the updated booster as soon as possible. Can I receive a flu shot and COVID-19 vaccine at the same time?

Yes. You can get a COVID-19 vaccine and other vaccinations like a flu or shingles vaccine at the same time or close together, [according to the CDC](#).

Can I mix and match COVID-19 vaccines?

Your booster does not need to be the same vaccine brand as your original COVID-19 vaccination, but it does need to be age appropriate. (currently Pfizer for ages 12 through 17 years old and either Pfizer or Moderna for ages 18 and older)

After having COVID-19, how long do I need to wait to get a booster?

You should wait until your 10-day period of isolation is over and any symptoms have improved. This is to ensure that you don't spread COVID-19 to others. Please ask your doctor if you have additional questions about timing.
