COVID SYMPTOMS FOR THE NEW STRATUS VARIANT



A new Covid variant, Stratus has become the dominant strain across the U.S. in the past few weeks. Fortunately, there is no evidence that this variant poses greater health risk than previous versions. Those that are older and did not get vaccinated last year will be at higher risk, as ell as young school age children. A high temperature and relentless cough are the most predominant symptoms in addition to: Shorten of breath, fatigue, body aches, headache, sore throat, nasal congestion, loss of appetite and diarrhea. At home treatment will suffice for most people with mild to moderate symptoms. For those people at high risk; elderly, pregnant women and those with serious medical conditions, prescription antiviral medications are available and work best when started within 5 days of symptom onset. Covid test are available at most pharmacies.

### Need Help Paying for Your Heating Bill?

SMOC's Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP), (previously known as fuel assistance), provides help with heating bills for eligible households.

The heating season runs from November 1st through April 30th.Eligibility for the home energy assistance program is based on the total gross income for all household members. The 2025 Income eligibility:\$49,196 for 1 person or \$64,333 for 2 people





In January/February, the state will mail each voter a postcard offering you the chance to Vote by Mail for any or all elections in 2026. If you chose to Vote by Mail, you must renew that decision every year.


